
The Thai Medical Women's Association Scholarship Program (Jason Roussos Memorial Medical Scholarship) 2021 Annual Report

History

Professor Dr. Kusuma Sanitwongse Na Ayutaya, Professor Emeritus in Political Science specialty in International Securities from Chulalongkorn University, daughter of Lieutenant General Dr. M.L. Ter Sanitwongse. Dr. Ter received Scholarship from His Majesty King Rama 9's mother to study Doctor in Medicine at USA. He came back and worked at hospital in Ubol Rachathani. Prof. Emeritus Dr. Kusuma absorbed major influence from her father. She is fully aware of the shortage of physicians and medical personnels in the rural region. She graduated from Tuft's University Massachusetts and received PhD from Fletcher School of Law and Diplomacy. She established and became chairman of ASEAN Institutes of Securities and International Studies. In 1980, she went to visit her relative M.L. Pirapongse Kasemsri who was the ambassador in Japan. She met Professor Dr. Jason Roussos, friendship began and further progressed into the topic of establishing Scholarship Fund for Medical Students who are willing to work in the rural area.

Professor Dr. Jason Roussos, The first who initiated Medical Student Scholarship Program and the first donator.

Dr. Jason Roussos was born in Greece, studied Physics at Brandeis University in Massachusetts and received Doctor of Philosophy from Oxford University. Professor Dr. Jason Roussos's family had very close relationships with King Mongkut Rama the sixth of Thailand. Professor Dr. Roussos taught Philosophy in Japan and also was a visiting professor at Thammasart and many other universities in Thailand. In 1988, he was honored the Companion(Fourth class) of the Most Noble Order of The Crown of Thailand, Royal decoration, on June 7, 1988 by His Majesty King Bhumibol Rama the ninth.



TMWA's Medical Students Scholarship Program (TMWAMSSP)

After Professor Dr. Jason Roussos passed away, Dr. George Curuby became the executor of Dr. Jason Roussos' estate. Following Professor Dr. Roussos' wish, Dr. Curuby and his wife Mrs. Tomoko Kanno had contacted Professor Emeritus Dr. Kusuma for assistance in establishing Medical Student Scholarship Program for the rural area of Thailand. Therefore TMWAMSSP was initiated.

Dr. Curuby donated 4.6millions Thai baht from Professor Dr. Jason Roussos to Dr. Suwanee Raktham who's was the president of the Thai Medical Women's Association to start the program. Subsequently this program has grown tremendously and is well supported by many Thai citizens.



Studies Medicine in Thailand.

There are 21 governmental medical schools and 2 private medical schools that are accredited by the Thai Medical Council. This involves 6 years of schooling and 3 years of working in the rural area. The main criteria for selection are female medical students from rural area with plan to stay there after graduating, and students who are in need of financial support. Students will receive monthly stipends from 3,000 baht per month for 10 months a year and later is increased to 5,000 – 5,500 baht per month and tuition fee about 10,000 baht biannually. Students will receive Fund for 6 year until she graduated. TMWAMSSP will also provide free transportation to come for interview in Bangkok. In year 2019, TMWAMSSP also sponsored one of our students to join youth members of the Medical Women's International Association in New York for 100 years anniversary of MWIA.

There was an exception in the year of 2004, year sixth medical student was the victim of tsunami, so TMWAMSSP sponsored both living expenses and tuition fee for her only three years.

Procedure

In order to pursue this project, by following Professor Dr. Jason Roussos' inspiring philanthropist intention, TMWA joins up with Collaborative Project to Increase Production of Rural Doctors (CPIRD) of the Office of the Permanent Secretary Ministry of Public Health. This is an opportunity for students from rural regions including both community track and inclusive track from remote provinces such as Mae Hong Son, Nan, Phetchaboon, Tak, Nakorn Panom, Nhong Bua Lumpoo, Bueng Kan, Sra Kaew, Yala, Narathiwas, etc. Selected students from CIPRD are submitted to TMWA, and TMWA committee will review applicants and ask students to come for interview. The final candidates will be announced before October and they will come to Association on October annual meeting to receive the award with paying gratitude to donors.

Progression of TMWAMSSP

In 2005, Dr. George Curuby, donated 100,000.00 \$ from Dr. Jason Roussos' Foundation as the ground breaking and 11 students received these funds. He came to TMWA annual meeting and was greeted by Dr. Suwanee Raktham who was the president of TMWA. Year after year, Dr. Curuby has put lots of effort for this program, not only donates his own capital, he also persuades several friends and families. In the meantime more and more Thai citizens also donate additional funds to this program. Additionally any capital that donated by Thai Citizens. Dr. Curuby would find his friends to matchup the donated funds. By the end of June 2022, year 17th of the program we provide total of 145 Scholarship, of which 58 were graduated, 83 still in schools, 3 changed faculty, 1 declined the Scholarship because finally family are able to provide support and one student is asking to switch medical school.

Main selection criteria for recipients of this including female students from rural area and intend to stay there after graduation, students from indigenous families, students' grade are not the main criteria. But majority of our students have good to excellent grade, some even receives award. Half of the recipients received Scholarship in high schools. Half of students came from farmers' families. One fifth lost one or both parents, or parents who separated or divorced. Some are with families' debts or illness. (see chart and table)
